In Case of Emergency

"ICE" your cell phone.

Most of us don't like to think about the "what ifs" when it comes to life-threatening emergencies. But what if the unthinkable happened? How would first-responders know who to contact to get your vital medical information and inform your family?

One of the simplest ways is to "ICE" your cell phone. That doesn't mean putting it in the freezer. ICE stands for "In Case of Emergency."

Here's how it works: Create a new cell phone contact. In the name line, enter "ICE," followed by the first name of your emergency point person (for example, "ICE Mark"). Choose someone who knows your medical history and can answer questions about allergies and medications you're currently taking.

STICK WITH IT



Paramedic Bob Brotchie originated the ICE concept after working the 2005 London bombings.

Today, ICE is catching on - here and abroad - and it's evolving. Brotchie's own data call center (www.icecontact.com), which stores your emergency contact information, as well as your medical history (including current medications you're taking), and provides it to first-responders; and stickers (www.icesticker.com) to place on the outside of your cell phone to alert first-responders that ICE contacts are programmed into your phone.
